Smith moved and Mcdonald seconded action to open the public hearing at 6:33pm on Ordinances 575 – Water Rates, 576- Sewer Rates, and 577 – Fireworks. Water and sewer rate increase being considered is the annual 2% increase effective July 1, 2024. Fireworks ordinance is to amend the dates and times they can be exploded to match the State of Iowa Code. No public comments. Smith moved and Rasmussen seconded action to close the public hearing at 6:35pm. No discussion, motions carried five ayes.

Kuester moved and Mcdonald seconded action on the First Reading of Ordinance 575 - Water Rates, an ordinance amending water rates by 2% effective July 1, 2024. No further discussion, motion carried five ayes

Lamp moved and Mcdonald seconded action on the First Reading of Or-dinance 576 – Sewer Rates, an ordinance amending sewer rates by 2% effective July 1, 2024. No further discussion, motion carried five ayes

Smith moved and Kuester seconded action on the First Reading of Ordi-nance 577 – Fireworks, an ordinance to amend the allowable dates and times for exploding fireworks within the City limits. This ordinance is to match the City code to the State of Iowa Code. No further discussion, motion carried five ayes.

Rasmussen moved and Smith seconded action on Resolution 2024-40, a resolution authorizing the purchase of real estate property of 401 I Avenue, Grundy Center. Mayor Eberline commented that this property has been deteriorating over the past several years and the property owners came to the City to discuss options. Lamp asked if the City would tear down the house and why does the City need to bail out property owners who do not care for their property themselves. Eberline explained that if the City purchases this property and tears down the house, the property valuations in the area would increase. Rich Ahlberg asked why the City is considering purchasing more properties to continue to lose money on the lots. Smith explained the City is able to clear up a nuisance/D&D property and sell the lot for new development thus recouping costs through higher property tax valuations. Seth Schroeder, City Attorney, explained the City has the ability to enforce the Nuisance and Dangerous Building section in the code of ordinance, however legal fees are charged thus costing the City more overall with the same outcome. Smith moved and Mcdonald seconded to amend the motion to counteroffer for the price of the land only at \$8280. No further dis-cussion, motion carried five ayes.

Mayor Eberline opened the discussion on the future of the city police department and police chief position. Eberline commented that the ability to continue with a local police force has been an ongoing discussion for many years. Local police department versus an agreement with Grundy County Sheriff for police coverage is the option currently being discussed. Eber-line asked for input from the current police officers. Discussion was on low salaries, no leadership, working many hours, fatigue, and burn out. County Sheriff Kirk Dolleslager commented that the county coverage could add more stability going forward if current city officers choose to apply and test, salary is much higher with the county and officers are required to live within the county. Mcdonald commented that she is extremely uncomfortable with making this decision without lots of input from the community residents because local coverage could drastically change. Lamp asked the current officers what you feel is missing or needed for a local police department to continue. Eberline commented that a public meeting will be planned for Monday, June 24, 2024, at 6:30pm in the Community Center, 705 F Avenue. Therefore decisions can also be made on how to proceed. No further discussion, no formal action taken at this time.

Mayor Eberline opened the public forum at 7:02pm. Rich Ahlberg commented on junk cars in vacant

lot on D Avenue and potholes on the state highway. No further comments, public forum closed at 7:06pm.

Finance Committee/Clerk made no comments. Public Safety Committee made no comments.

Public Works Committee commented that tennis court at the Sports Complex will be sandblasted and resurfaced in the next couple of weeks. Smith moved and Lamp seconded adjournment of the meeting at 7:10pm. Motion carried five ayes. Next meeting will be Monday, June 17, 2024, at 6:30pm
